

INTERACTIVE PLAY TILES





LIGHT SCULPTURE



2. Light Art - Approach

Creation of three potential interactive art zones



1) Sound Tunnel

A simple sound tunnel running under Broadway. This would involve a low powered, robust sound installation triggered as the public walks along the creek path. Interactive art can helps to build community


Viewers talk to each other and play within the sculpture together.


Interactive art promotes physically activity


The sculpture inspires viewers to run, jump and actively play on it, in, and with each other.


4. Light Art - Required Principle: Life and Property Safety

Adding Light

Adding interactive illumination to an environment creates safer space. Instead of a dark tunnel, or dark empty park, you find an illuminated active sculpture that changes as users are near. Those who might loiter hidden will not be inclined to stay in an area with lights triggered by human interaction.

Adding Sound

Sound, when used properly also greatly changes the way a space feels. It keeps those who might loiter away (their presence would trigger sound), and it activates a space making it less attractive for crime.





Arc Harps: interactive laser harp played by passing your hand through the beams. Currently on public tour.








6. Light - Community Activity and Arts
