










Typical Community Park Characteristics


- Serves 2 or more neighborhoods
- Optimal size: 20-50 acres
- Often established as preservation of unique landscapes
- Geographically centered
- Ease of access for both vehicles and pedestrians
- Includes both active and passive recreation
- Variety of vegetation and topography
- Adjacent to natural resource areas & greenways (linkages)
- Active recreation is informal and unstructured
- Not intended to be used extensively for programmed adult athletic use and tournaments



- Large play structures and/or creative play attractions
- Game courts
- Informal ball fields for youth play
- Tennis courts
- Volleyball courts
- Shuffleboard, horseshoes
- Pickleball
- Ice skating
- Swimming pool
- Disc golf

PASSIVE SPACE

- Internal trail network
- Individual and group picnic or sitting areas
- General open lawn space
- Unique landscape features
- Nature study areas
- Ornamental gardens
- Space for cultural activities (plays, concerts, events)
- Parking lots to accommodate user access
- Lighting for safety / security
- Lighting for facilities




